- 2. Domonstrates how to create this beingness.
- 3. Establish communication by teaching the language of the subject.
- 4. Exemplify the communication symbols with demenstrations of ridiculous errors.

 When established teach:
- 1. Each word and its definition that is used in practice. Underline strange words.
- 2. Diagnosis. You must reconize ("Conditions we are seeking to change") i.e. Obnosis.
- 3. System of classification.
- 4. Means of changing each class or type of child, and maintenance of state.
