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ACC Tr

The following ACC Tr has been okayed for use on the 1st Johannesburg ACC:

Name: Security Check

Commands: No set questions or commands. Whatever questions necessary to establish whether or not person being checked is a security risk.

Position: Auditor and coach seated facing each other at normal auditing distance. Coach will use his arm to simulate E-meter needle.

Purpose: To increase auditor's responsibility, control, and certainty in running security checks.

Training Stress: Coach silently decides what sort of security risk he will pretend to be, and invents a suitable history, beingness, and set of intentions for himself. Then announces to auditor: "I'm a security risk. Check me out. Start." The coach will produce needle phenomena in accordance with his invented history. It is up to the auditor to get the story out of him by needle reaction alone. Coach will not answer any questions verbally. When auditor has established a "fact" about the coach to his own satisfaction he announces it to the coach. (For example, "You have been a member of the Communist Party." or, "That fruit store robbery occurred in 1947"). If correct, the coach says so. If incorrect, coach makes him go over the same area again, until he has interpreted the needle reactions accurately.

When student auditor has become expert at this, the coach will no longer say at the beginning of a sequence that he is a security risk. He will simply say "Start", and leave it up to the auditor to find out whether he has a clean or unsavoury past. The coach may now answer questions verbally as well. He should lie, and attempt to mislead auditor verbally (but never with his arm "needle" reactions) when posing as a bad character.
