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LATEST DATA ON HAVINGNESS

This is a letter received from HCO WW Technical Secretary, Robin Harper, addressed to the Directors of Training and Processing:

"The latest data on Havingness is as follows. Ron says it has taken him thirty years of research to find it out.

Havingness is the willingness and ability of the pc to duplicate.

As such it is directly related to the communication cycle. If one does not complete the comm. cycle by duplicating it, one is hung up right there. It is an arrested cycle of action. It goes on automatic, and thereafter one is compulsively looking for the motivator which will enable him to finish it. Overt-Motivator Sequence and Ded-dedex.

So a pc is as bad off as he has been bad.

I hit you - you fall down hurt. . . . I am not willing to duplicate that part of the cycle. I can't duplicate that which I can't "have". So the common denominator of all low cases is their unwillingness to have and to duplicate. They can't have the things or people against which or whom they have overts. So the first thing to do is to find the havingness process which will GIVE the pc havingness.

Until this is done auditing is useless as you are probably auditing circuits. As havingness drops - circuits come in.

We now have thirtytwo pre-sessions (I'm asking Ron to let me send them to you soon.) Out of these you can find something WILL give havingness. Experiment until you do. Once found the only thing which can stall a case is that the pc is in a situation which he finds difficult to duplicate. So a pc who goes out reading at 2 and comes in reading at 6 has struck a PTP or an ARC break which amounts to O/Ws. Get those overts OFF. Ask what question shouldn't I ask you. . . . He may come across with some big overt or a little one which will bring the Tone Arm down. Well the process has started to change. . . . don't leave it there. . . . continue the process until no more change is occurring. Follow the auditor's code. Dig for more. Get them ALL off.

Ron says "A cessation of the progress of a case indicates the pc has hit a situation he can't duplicate" Whatever it is get him to look at it and duplicate it or "have" it. Then go back to the processes being run. Don't go looking for another process to resolve the case.
