New Experimental Havingness Processes:

"What problem could that wall be?"

Confront Processes:

"What unworkable situation could you confront?"

"What unworkable situation would you rather not confront?"

"What sexual activity could you confront?"

"What sexual activity would you rather not confront?"

"What sound (or other perception) could you confront?"

"What sound (or other perception) would you rather not confront?"

"Think of a problem."
