VARYING SEC CHECK QUESTIONS

You only vary a sec check question when by repeating it you would create an impasse.

Example: 'Have you stolen anything?'

'Yes, an apple.'

'Good, Have you stolen anything?'

'No. '

'Good. (Look at meter).
Have you stolen anything?'

'No.' (meter reacts).

NOW vary the question.

And always end by making sure the <u>original</u> question 'Have you stolen anything?' is nul.

This all comes under the heading of getting one auditing question answered before you ask a second.

If you create an impasse you will pile up missed witholds, throw ruds out and really mess it up. Therefore, until you do find out what the answer was on a sec check question, you do NOT repeat the question - only variations (except to test for nul after getting a withold) until the meter nuls on the first question.
