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INQUISITIVE TR

PURPOSE:

To train student to be inquisitive about his pc and to familiarise him with asking pertinent questions.

Position:

Coach and student seated facing each other. Coach has in his hand a picture from an advertisement, picture book, book of paintings or whatever is available, which the student hasn't seen and is not allowed to see until the end of the drill.

Procedure:

Student is required to ask questions of the Coach about the picture until he has a very good idea as to the contents and colours of the picture. He should also find out about perspectives.

Patter:

Coach is only allowed to answer "YES" "NO" or 'MAYBE". He must be honest in his answers. If he doesn't know the answer or cannot answer he says either "I don't know" or "I can't answer that".

Training Stress:

As with other TRs, if student com lags or becomes misemotional, or incoherent or tongue-tied, Coach asks "What happened?" Student at first should be allowed about half an bour to find out about the picture and then should be asked to describe the picture. He is then shown the picture and encouraged to find out how he could have done better. The drill needs to be continued until Student can freely ask questions and rapidly find out all there is to be found in a picture. As facility becomes more normal, the time the student is allowed is decreased by gradients to 30 seconds.
