TRIPLE RUDIMENTS

Now that we have triple lower grades we can also have Triple Rudiments.

Triple Rudiments are used as per HCOB 25th January 1969.

The rudiments are run in flows consecutively item by item as follows:

ARC BREAK:

- F-1: "Do you have an ARC Break?"
F-2: "Does someone have an ARC Break with you?"
F-3: "Does another have an ARC Break with others?"

PTP:

- F-1: "Do you have a present time problem?"
F-2: "Does someone have a PTP with you?"
F-3: "Does another have a PTP with others?"

MW/H:

- F-1: "Has a withhold been missed?"
F-2: "Have you missed another's withhold?"
F-3: "Has another missed the withhold of others?"

W/H:

- F-1: "Are you withholding anything?"
F-2: "Is another withholding anything from you?"
F-3: "Is another withholding anything from others?"

Make sure that each of these ruds get cleared very well per Scientology Dictionary before running.

The wording of these has been carefully tested and found to be the most optimum to cover the widest span, and these rudiments must be known verbatim by all auditors.

A COMMON ERROR FOUND IN MODERN AUDITING IS AUDITING OVER OUT RUDS!!

The auditor goofs his first ARC break and the goof multiplies itself over the session ruining an entire C/S.

This can be rectified by PUTTING IN THE RUDS FOR THE PERIOD COVERED (as for example: "In your last session did you...etc... Rud.....?"), and uses the discovery that later on track one can put in the ruds on an earlier period.

Although Ron communicated this discovery to the class VIII students, it is of sufficient importance to be used by auditors of Level IV and above where metering is used in rudiment procedures.
