WHAT IS A READ

(Clarification of HCOB 27 May 1970  
Unreading Questions and Items)

- A. Per HCOB 27 May 1970 "Unreading Questions and Items", a question to be listed or an item to be run must read with a small fall or larger read.
- B. Neither the above issue nor HCOB 24 May 1970 "Auditors Rights" redefine "read" for any other type of auditing use. Only for selection of an item to run or a question to list is the term "read" defined as a small fall, fall, long fall, or long fall blowdown (of TA).
- C. For example, the definition of "instant read" from HCOB 25 May 1962 "E-Meter Instant Reads" remains otherwise unaltered: "An instant read may be any change of characteristic providing it occurs instantly". This definition still applies where it did before in all cases except selecting an item to run or a question to list.
- D. No use of the term "read" is changed by HCOB 27 May 1970 except for selection of a question to list or an item to run (whether by R3R, prepcheck, recalls or 2-way comm).
- E. Reads to be followed up on rudiments, correction lists, confessional questions, prepcheck buttons, etc. are not affected by the definitions of "read" in HCOB 27 May 1970 "Unreading Questions and Items" nor by the definition at the top of page three of HCOB 24 May 1970 "Auditors Rights".
- F. An instant read on ruds or such is run or used - however tiny or large that read may be.
