C/S SERIES 37 ADDITION

TA RISING WHILE LISTING O/R LIST

Para 7 from the top page 1 of HCOB 19 MAY 71 C/S SERIES 37 states "If the TA while listing starts up again markedly (not just .2 Divs) and continues on up, the auditor missed the F/N."

This applies to Overrun lists. It does not apply to general listing.

In usual listing it is common for a TA to begin at, say 2.8, soar to 3.7, then BD on the BD F/N item to say 2.6. "Who or what would _____" and any other list except an O/R list rises.

O/R lists are curing O/R and usually rise only on protest.

F/N ODDITY

You can get more than one BD F/N item on an O/R list if you keep going on and on.

In effect you are using the same listing Question for several lists.

In other words, a lot of things can be overrun.

It's the first BD F/N item that you want. If you go on you can get another and another and wind up with several F/N items. Really you have done several lists!

According to data to hand, if this goes on perpetually, you'll wind up with a no item in the first place situation. You used the list as a sort of process! And indeed, it is more of a process than a list.

The CORRECT handling is to do the 3 actions in ONE session with no delays of between sessions or breaks.

- A. List what has been Overrun? to a BD F/N item.
- B. List "who or what would (item)" to a BD F/N item.
- C. Run O/W on the B item to a wide F/N Cog VGIs.

When you fail to do all three in one session, DON'T fool about if the TA is high next session. Just rehab and do B above and C.

If you've done ABC nicely and the TA is high next session (unlikely), you do an L4B to be sure no list error was made. If one was made, correct it, redo the remaining steps.

However it is far more likely that a new O/R item has come up. Just do A, B, C again as though never done before.

If you find someone has done an O/R list with 4 or so BD F/N items on it, you can do steps A, B, C on each one.

Unlike most listing actions the O/R list is not limited to use it once and that's it. You can use it several times.

TWO FLOW O/W

It may be a temptation to run the O/W step backwards, item to pc. Don't. It can be done but it also backfires at times.

Correct Example: O/R Item (A) is "Shooting Ducks". W/W Item (B) is "John". Correct action of C step is "What have you done to John?" "What have you withheld from John?" Alternate, repetitive to F/N. (It would be incorrect and risky to run "What has John done to pc" "What has John w/h from pc".)

The reason A B C should be done all in one session is that the O/R item itself does not blow on simply finding it. It merely keys out. It can key in in minutes, hours or days unless handled.

DATING

After being handled by A B C, any pressure area associated with the item can be additionally handled IF THE A, B, C IS DONE FIRST.

In this case the steps are (to the drill):

1. Get an idea of the type of incident by asking for it, or if it's a smash-up, a shock, violence, etc. Scan it once.
2. Date it exactly by dating drill and meter down to the months days and minutes and seconds. This will F/N if smoothly accurately done.
3. Now find out where it happened. Have pc point - how far - name of sun and planet etc. This will produce a second F/N. You do it until you get an F/N.

The pressure will vanish and you'll get a wide F/N, Cog, VGIs.

If subsequently there's anything left of it, give it the Dianetic treatment. List its somatics etc. R3R (Quad if it's a quad pc).

If you have any doubt about the auditor dating skill, omit this step as he'll wind the pc up in a ball if he can't date.

It's a bonus step anyway, getting rid of some chronic somatic. The O/R steps A B C are enough in most cases.

To use this O/R procedure the Auditor has to have:

1. Excellent TRs.
2. Good metering.
3. Knowledge of the Code.
4. Laws of Listing and Nulling down pat.
5. Starrate on C/S Series 37 and C/S Series 37 Addition.
6. Must be skilled on dating.
7. The Ext RD pack.

Before using this be sure the Auditor who is to audit it, is sent to Cramming for all the above.

Then your High TA troubles are mostly over. I say mostly because we have found that Theosophical exercises done between sessions and drugs and other odds and ends can keep a TA up. In these odd cases, a very searching D of P interview (doing a

white form etc.) and questions about doing things between sessions usually produce the odd-ball answer. Very severe w/hs can also baffle one but these show up on a GF + 40 once through.

Very very severe somatics respond to the O/R A, B, C providing they're all done right and all done in one session. They stay off best when the Dating action is added to the RD.
