LRH ORIGINATIONS AND LRH OKAYS

Originations by LRH in the nature of Policies, Plans, Programs, Projects, Orders, stated Ideal Scenes or VFPs are very much the business of the LRH Comm in any area in which the above apply.

His duty is to follow them down fully.

An action by another which has been submitted to LRH for an approval and is given an LRH okay on the representation that the action is not against policy, is needed, and is correct for the situation in which the action is proposed. Once approved, the action has the authority of the type of particle that it is issued as - as a PL, an ED, FO, order, or whatever.

This approved action is thereafter the responsibility of other terminals in the organization as demanded by their post functions and duties, and as assigned in the issue itself.

It is NOT the LRH Comm's duty to follow down actions that have been originated by another and approved by LRH.

Those items are not logged or nudged by the LRH Comm.

They may cross his lines in his investigations of bugged LRH projects or org areas. In these cases, his interest is in debugging and his handling is appropriate to the case.

When such an item is found as a bug, HCO PL 15 Dec 69 "Orders, Query of" is the HCO PL to apply. It is not necessarily only applied by the LRH Comm of the org, but CSWs presented to the LRH Comm on an illegal or destructive order can be quickly handled or referred to Flag for swift remedy.
