Does Intern OK to Audit Drug RD in Qual.

AUDITING: To fulfill the auditing requirement, the student is routed to the Intern Section of Qual. He audits in the Drug Unit (Dept 10) as an Intern until he has shown consistent standard, well done auditing on the program.

Additional study and drilling will be required of the Intern for flubs done in sessions. These additional studies will be done in the Cramming Section of Qual Div., which only handles specific deficiencies and would return the intern promptly to auditing. The idea is to get the student actually auditing, improving his auditing, and learning by experience in auditing with rapid cramming of weak points.

Completion of the auditing requirements is when the student has shown consistent standard, well done application and results of all parts of the Drug Program within his training level. This is determined by the C/S.

Additional drilling when the auditor reaches higher levels must be separately attested to on a new sheet by all attestees.
