HANDLING DANGER CONDITIONS

(Originally written by LRH for the Apollo OODs of 12 Apr. 72. Issued as an HCO Policy Letter on 13 Oct. 80.)

The right way to really handle a Danger Condition assigned one is to get an assessment on HCO PL 9 Apr. 72 and get a Why found and then do the 1st Dynamic formula in that PL.

Esto Series 13, DOING WORK, is what the Why is actually trying to solve - "how doesn't he really do what he's supposed to be doing."

The assessment gives one the AREA of the Why.

That 1st Dynamic Danger formula is quite something. It is written in a very short form. The 1st 1 really means, knock off doing the Why found!

When I was studying this subject, I found that this formula (fully laid out) would practically solve a case! At least the dangerous elements of one. (It doesn't change auditing tech.)

If you read Esto 13 and then 9 Apr. 72 PL you'll see how it all fits.
